# **Conference Description**

The International Conference on Austronesian Linguistics (ICAL) gathers scholars who work on all aspects of Austronesian languages from varying theoretical and methodological perspectives. It serves as a significant platform for sharing new knowledge and ideas, and for discussing emerging research trends in the context of Austronesian Linguistics. Consequently, it aims to sustain the conversations and discussions on one of the world's largest and most diverse language families in the areas of historical and comparative linguistics, morphosyntax, language documentation and description, and other relevant subfields of linguistics. ICAL started as a quadrennial conference in 1974, and is now held periodically every 2-3 years and has already been hosted by various institutions around the world.

Following the success of the past ICALs, and in commemoration of its 50<sup>th</sup> year of inception, the Sixteenth International Conference on Austronesian Linguistics (16-ICAL) is returning to the Philippines and will be held at the **De La Salle University, Manila** on 20-24 June, 2024. This 5-day event is jointly hosted by the Department of English and Applied Linguistics, De La Salle University (**DLSU-DEAL**); the Linguistic Society of the Philippines (LSP), and the Department of Linguistics, University of the Philippines Diliman (UP-LINGG).

### **Call for Proposals**

### Individual Papers/Poster

Individual papers are formal presentations on any aspect of language or linguistics focusing on Austronesian languages. These presentations may be delivered by either a single author or multiple authors. Each individual slot is given 30 minutes: 20 minutes for the presentation and 10 minutes for the Q&A.

Submissions are limited to one individual and one joint abstract per author. Abstracts should be single-spaced, 12-point font and limited to two A4 (or US Letter) pages including data, figures, and references. Please ensure that the authors' names do not appear on the abstract itself.





Ongoing projects may be submitted as poster proposals. In addition, there will also be a **student poster session** which will allow students of Austronesian linguistics to present the results of their research or on-going projects.

#### Panel Presentations

Panel Presentations are designed to foster in-depth discussions on specific topics related to Austronesian Linguistics. Each panel presentation occupies a 120-minute block, ensuring comprehensive exploration and discussion of the topic. Panel organizers have the flexibility to determine the number of presenters (4-5) and the structure of the Q&A as long as there is enough time for discussions with the audience.

The recommended structure for panel presentations is: Introduction and backgrounder by the panel organizer: 5 minutes 4-5 presentations: either 15 minutes or 20 minutes each Audience discussions: 20 minutes

For panel proposals, please observe the following:

- The panel organizer must present an overview of the panel. This should include Panel Title (max of 15 words) Panel description or overview (no more than 300 words).
- 2) Each presenter is required to provide the panel organizer with Session Title (max of 15 words) Session Abstract (no more than 300 words).
- 3) The panel organizer is responsible for the panel submissions. This includes the submission of the title and abstract for the entire panel, along with the titles and abstracts of each individual presentation.
- 4) The panel organizer is responsible for communicating with the individual presenters the Results of the submissions.
